

Official Statement – Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL)

Mumbai, April 13, 2026: Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited (BPCL), a Fortune Global 500 company and a Maharatna PSU, acknowledges the order issued by the National Green Tribunal regarding the appeal over the implementation of Vapour Recovery Systems (VRS) at specific storage terminals.

This matter relates to directives from the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), including an environmental compensation of ₹1 crore imposed for failing to install VRS at 28 terminals within the required timeframe. BPCL had previously submitted requests to the CPCB for an extension and a waiver, citing operational and implementation challenges.

Although the appeal against the CPCB's subsequent directives has been dismissed, BPCL respects the judicial process and is dedicated to ensuring full regulatory compliance.

The installation of Vapour Recovery Systems at terminals remains a top priority for BPCL, reflecting the company's broader commitment to environmental protection, emission reduction, and sustainable practices. The Corporation is actively taking steps to complete the remaining installations promptly, in accordance with relevant guidelines.

BPCL emphasizes that environmental stewardship is a fundamental aspect of its operational philosophy, and it will continue to collaborate closely with regulatory authorities to ensure compliance with all established norms.
