# Students who audited India's exam system

## NEET to CBSE, in the summer of exam discontent, Gen Z investigators are asking the most difficult questions

### THE TEEN-ACE SLEUTHS

#### VEDANT SRIVASTAVA (17)

The face of the OSM controversy, is a Delhi-based Class 12 student whose Physics scanned answer sheet was wrongly uploaded under his roll number. CBSE later acknowledged the issue and sent the correct copy. Vedant, who was trolled and called 'Pakistani' for pointing out OSM flaws, has helped fellow students through re-evaluation



#### SARTHAK SIDDHANT (17)

A Class 12 student from Jharkhand, he moved the spotlight from OSM performance to tender scrutiny. He compared CBSE tender documents, alleged changes in eligibility and evaluation conditions that led to the selection of Coempt, and later presented his findings before a parliamentary standing committee



#### NISARGA ADHIKARY (19)

#### RYLEN ANIL (16)

The Dubai resident is a movie buff who just can't get enough of solving puzzles. It was a conversation with Nisarga Adhikary, who cast the spotlight on tech loopholes in the CBSE test portal, that led him to look into the NTA site. He soon found vulnerabilities that could lead to unauthorised access to key data. He promptly flagged the issues to NTA and says flaws like these should be reported before they are misused

Speaking to TOI, Delhi-based Vedant Srivastava said he did not know he would become a whistleblower when he pointed out that his Class 12 physics paper evaluated by CBSE wasn't in fact his. His post, the first to draw attention to the CBSE fiasco, also drew trolls, who called the Class 12 Delhi-based student "Pakistani".

#### The Whistleblower

"I never expected that things would turn out the way they did... that some people will love me and others will troll me. I am simply a student who was trying to get his real answer sheet after I was sent a wrong one," Vedant told TOI this week.

After the Class 12 results were announced, he found he got 65 in physics, incongruous with the rest of his papers, where his scores were in the 90s or 80s. "I should have scored higher, it was a good exam. The next option for me was to apply for the scanned photocopy of my answer sheet, so I did," the 17-year-old said.

The answer sheet he received had his school number and roll number on the first page, but the handwriting on the paper was someone else's. He compared the paper with his English and computer science scripts and posted the discrepancy on X on May 23. "I was trolled endlessly by people online, some even called me anti-

national," he said.

Vedant thought of giving up at one point but was encouraged by his parents to carry on the fight because it wasn't he who was wrong. "After my post went viral, many other students reached out to me. That is when I realised the extent of this problem. I helped roughly 30 more students get their issues sorted, connecting them to the right authorities and telling them the way to go about it," he said.

The second surprise for Vedant came when he eventually received his real answer script. His real score was 74, but he realised the paper was checked manually, not through OSM. "I was confused again because this showed there was an OSM for some scripts while others were checked manually," he said.

On his answer sheet were handwritten notes by the evaluator that he could not decipher. Vedant is applying for re-evaluation and wants to keep his focus on his engineering college admission, where "a few marks here and there can make a huge difference".

"It's clear that the board is not prepared for OSM checking on a mass scale. The announcement that papers will be checked via OSM was made barely a week before the exam. That did not give time for teachers to get acquainted with the new system. There are some senior teachers in my school who can't even operate a mouse and keyboard. How would they switch to OSM checking without training?" he asked.

#### The Tech Audit

While the student community voiced its anger online, a 19-year-old cybersecurity researcher in Bengaluru had known this was coming for months. Driven by curiosity after completing his Class 12 boards, Nisarga Adhikary had examined CBSE's portal this Feb and found holes that could allow unauthorised users to bypass au-

#### hentication and alter marks.

"One could log in as an examiner using a master password exposed in the frontend, bypass OTP protection entirely because validation occurred only on the browser, and access internal pages without authentication," Nisarga told TOI over email.

After he found the vulnerabilities, he wrote to CERT-IN. When the OSM fiasco blew up in May, Adhikary published his findings in a blog that was shared on X by Deedy Das, partner at a San Francisco-based VC firm, on May 26.

"The vulnerabilities also made it possible to reset an exami-

ner's password without knowing the current one and, through systemic IDOR (a security vulnerability in which a web application exposes internal data directly to users) issues across the API, act as a user to edit marks, modify examiner details, and potentially tamper with the entire evaluation process," he wrote in the blog. So obvious, according to him, were the gaps that "it was one of the easiest hacks of my life".

In his blog, he added, "The whole app is walk-in. Even setting the login flow aside, the app's routing offered no protection... It's honestly funny that most of the vulnerabilities I reported went unpatched for a long time when I'd have fixed them in an hour or two if they were mine to fix. The sheer incompetence of our authorities baffles me."

As Nisarga's post gained traction, CBSE issued a public clarification, denying that its live evaluation system had been breached. The board maintained vulnerabilities identified by him were found in a testing environment that contained only dummy data and was not connected to the actual answer sheet evaluation process. But Nisarga continued to publish technical details and screenshots to support his claims.

CBSE blinked, eventually. On May 31, the board announced that it had taken steps to strengthen the security of its service provider's OnMark portal and digital security experts from govt and IITs had been deployed to secure the platform.

#### The Tender Audit

And yet, performance of OMS wouldn't be the most difficult question CBSE would have to field. A Class XII student in Jharkhand, riled by the mismatch in his papers like Vedant, decided to dig deeper. Sarthak Siddhant's said his investigation of publicly available CBSE tender documents rela-

ted to the selection of its vendor found key eligibility criteria were altered before the OSM contract was awarded to Hyderabad-based Coempt EduTech.

Sarthak (17) told TOI he doesn't think transfer of CBSE officials is "proper action". "One must take accountability and responsibility to explain what, where and why things went wrong." The boy from JYM Shyamali in Ranchi who loves coding and wants to study computer science said he was hopeful the ongoing probe will come up with a long-term remedy. "My actions weren't based on

personal vendetta towards CBSE but driven solely out of curiosity. It's a question of the future of lakhs of students. I won't be satisfied till the time I get answers to all the questions I have raised through my blog," he said.

What got him into digging was a chat with "longtime friend" Nisarga. "What began as an exercise just out of inquisitiveness turned out to be a marathon affair: Nisarga, myself and a few others went on to dig into scores of CBSE tenders," he said, adding he began his probe on May 22. It took him six days to publish his blog.

He compared multiple versions of the board's tender documents and claimed to have found at least 15 inconsistencies. He alleged clauses relating to poor performance, blacklisting, financial qualification requirements and project eligibility were either modified or removed in successive tender documents.

On the blog, Sarthak pulled no punches. "My thesis is that the rules, terms, conditions and clauses were rewritten to favour a specific vendor. The vendor happened to be Coempt EduTech. This was done at the expense of national data security, and the future of students," he wrote.

According to him, CBSE issued three separate tenders for OSM. The first was removed from the Govt e-Marketplace portal, and the second did not result in a successful bidder after the technical evaluation stage. The third tender, in which TCS was also in the race, was awarded to EduTech firm Coempt EduTech. This tender did not contain the clauses that could disqualify a service provider on grounds of unsatisfactory performance that the earlier ones did. "For the board, a track record of poor performance didn't matter anymore. If they had kept this clause, Coempt's catastrophic operational history under the name Globarena in Telangana would have been a massive legal hurdle for their qualification," he wrote.

Globarena was associated with processing the Telangana State Board of Intermediate Education results in 2019. After the results were declared, large-scale errors surfaced. A Telangana govt-appointed committee found Globarena did not meet baseline work-experience criteria. The errors were serious: 531 geography students' practical marks disappeared from memos and 496 students had 'AP' printed instead of marks. The committee attributed the errors to flaws in software design and implementation.

This week, Sarthak presented his findings to a parliamentary standing committee. The student, like the other teenagers who have called CBSE out, has maintained that digital evaluation itself is a positive reform, but a system of such scale should undergo extensive pilot testing before being rolled out nationwide. He has also called for greater transparency in govt procurement and easier public access to tender-related data and records.

CBSE has rejected allegations of wrongdoing in the tendering process and said the procurement and implementation of the OSM system followed due procedure.

Sarthak will, meanwhile, wait for re-evaluation of his paper as he is unsatisfied by his scores. OSM, he insisted, isn't the problem as new innovations are the way forward but "they need to be

done in a proper manner and for public good".

#### Boy Who Woke Up NTA

Rylen Anil's excursion into the NTA portal followed a conversation with Nisarga, with whom the Class 12 student said he collaborated in finding the OSM vulnerabilities. "It was an effort to make our country a little safer," is how the 16-year-old puts it.

"While talking to Nisarga, I came to understand that many govt portals have similar weaknesses," Rylen told TOI over a call from Dubai, where he has grown up. His parents are from Kerala.

The teenager, a movie buff who is hooked to puzzles, said he is driven by the belief that such flaws should be reported before they are misused. On the NTA portal, Rylen went into the NEET section and came across an administrative dashboard as he looked around. "I realised something was wrong with the portal when I found a page labelled 'Super Admin Dashboard'. Once I was able to gain access to it, that was when I thought, 'Okay this is something huge'."

"When Nisarga and I were investigating the CBSE portal, we found names, phone numbers and email addresses of candidates who had paid for re-evaluation. In NTA, it was similar," he said. Without revealing technical details, Rylen said the problem stemmed from weak credentials. "Through that vulnerability, I was able to gain access. I believe I had access to

information relating to around 7,000 observers, including their email addresses, phone numbers and full names. With those, one could generate appointment letters and view observer mappings through the portal. One could easily generate official documents as well. If this had been discovered by a malicious actor, it could have caused a lot of stress and confusion among NEET students. I don't believe it would have allowed anyone to change final results, but it definitely had the potential to fuel hysteria," he said.

Rylen reported the breaches to NTA on May 31. "I also posted on X and went to sleep. When I woke up next morning, I saw my post had gone viral. NTA officials had already reached out to me through email. They responded promptly, and I must say I'm very appreciative of them because they were able to resolve the issue quickly."

Indian organisations, according to him, have a "security through obscurity" problem, relying on keeping pages hidden to keep them secure. "Many pages are hidden, but if someone can find them, they can exploit them. The 'Super Admin' portal was not publicly available. I had to actively search for it. Hiding pages is useful, but proper security measures also need to be put in place. More effort had gone into hiding the portal than actually securing it."
