New opportunities for collaborations

My dear Colleague,

Wishing you the very best of the new Financial Year. A new financial year always promises new opportunities for collaboration. As we move into FY 2023-24, let me extend my sincere gratitude to each one of you for the great performance by team Kochi Refinery in 2022-23. We have registered one of the best performances in terms of Safety, GRM, Energy efficiency and the production targets even with 30 days of shutdown of IREP.

On his recent visit to Kochi Refinery, Hon'ble Minister of State for Petroleum & Natural Gas, Shri Rameswar Teli, expressed that he has visited 22 out of 23 Refineries in India and Kochi Refinery is by far the most beautiful, clean and green Refinery amongst them all. This is indeed a great recognition for Kochi Refinery, and he has bestowed the entire credit for the same to all the employees of the Refinery and the allied staff who work day in and out for its sustained operations.

It gives me great pride in sharing this with you and also the major highlights of what we have together achieved in 2022-23. First let me commend each one of you on crossing the 79 million mark in safe working. Our safety record is 79.04 million man-hours for employees without Lost Time Accidents, which is equivalent to 6301 days or approx. 17 years as on 31st March 2023. Hearty congratulations on that.

OPERATIONS EXCELLENCE:

On the operations front, we have achieved Crude processing of 16.01 MMT against the business plan target of 16.00 MMT. We have also achieved the highest GRM and NRM and we have processed the highest quantity of discounted Russian grade crudes (Urals, Varandey and Sokol) among the Indian PSU refineries during FY 22-23 - approx. 5103 TMT through meticulous planning and mitigation of processing limitations.

My kudos to you on the successful completion of the first IREP turnaround, one of the biggest turnarounds in the history of Indian PSU Refineries with over 12,000 people working on peak days. The shutdown of the six integrated units was a major project in itself by virtue of the size, cost and the multitude of activities for 30 continuous days and seamless commissioning .

With the three new crudes processed in the year, we have widened the Refinery crude basket to a total of 106 crudes. We have posted highest ever annual production and sales for high value Refinery products namely MS, Benzene and Food grade hexane. We have also recorded highest monthly Benzene production through Benzene maximization scheme. Similarly we have marked higher monthly production and sales of Toluene and LPG. The 20" HTPL (Heat Traced Pipeline) was successfully converted from Black oil service to White oil service in December 2022. Since then, HTPL is being used as a dedicated pipeline for Naphtha product movement, thereby reducing slop generation of approx. 4500 kl/ month. I also complement you on completing the implementation of all the 17 PSM elements in MSBP and PDPP.

NET ZERO : In our commitment to BPCL's net zero mission, we have introduced several initiatives. Two Electric Vehicles and charging station were inducted into the Refinery carpool. The 6 MW Solar Power Project on Land and 6 MW solar power project on water bodies in tendering stages, one more step towards net zero.

PETROCHEMICALS: Post stabilization of Petchem complex, around 197 TMT of petrochemicals were produced in FY 22-23 against the previous year total of 92.3 TMT. PDPP Robotic Drum Filling facility commissioned in May 2022 has enhanced safe and faster operations. We have received the REACH (Registration, Evaluation, Authorization and Restriction of Chemicals) Compliance certification from M/s TUV India Laboratory, Mumbai for all 6 Petchem products and 3 special products (FGH, MTO and SBPS). With both NABL (ISO-17025) Accreditation and REACH Compliance certification, we are now capable of marketing these products in India as well as in European countries.

We have also started placing firm steps in SAP production. With the pilot study, the first batch of SAP (Super absorbent polymer) product was dispatched from KR to M/s. Bapuji Surgicals in July 2022. It is commendable that the imported PTSA catalyst was completely replaced by domestically manufactured PTSA catalyst in PDE unit without any yield variation in August 2022, thus saving approx. Rs. 1.6 Crores during FY 22-23. We also received the BIS License for Butyl Acrylate in Oct 2022 and achieved highest ever 2-EHA movement of 689 MT in the month of Jan'23, surpassing the previous best of 410 MT in Dec'22.

ENERGY SAVING INITIATIVES:

KR successfully achieved a total EII reduction of 6.0 units this year out of which 3.24 units is on account of IREP Turnaround and 2.76 units is on account of Energy Conservation initiatives, implemented. We also posted an annual energy savings of 2160 MWh through replacement of 6000 flameproof lights, 1600 tube lights and conventional light fittings with LED luminaires.

With Naphtha firing in Gas Turbines, we have assured a financial saving of Rs 35 Crs. (approx.) in FY 22-23 and with the complete stoppage of Fuel Oil consumption (0.5 % Sulphur) in one VHP boiler, we have brought reduction in higher cost low sulphur crude procurement apart from the financial savings of Rs 92 Lakhs/Annum, on account of steam saving with soot blowing rationalization and atomizing steam consumption reduction.

ADVANCE PROCESS CONTROL & DIGITAL:

With the implementation of APC (Advance Process Control) in Aromatic Recovery Unit, IREP Deaerators and all sections of MSBP complex we have brought down the Energy Intensity Index (EII) by 0.8 unit. We can take pride that the BPCL Petrochemical Complex became the first digitally connected plant of Kochi Refinery in Jan'23. With an aim of propylene maximization and LPG RVP prediction, Machine learning (ML) based propylene purity MATLAB model was developed & deployed successfully through APC. This involved an integration of MATLAB, EXCEL, PYTHON, MS SQL, IP21 and APC. This is the first of its kind integration in India with in-house efforts. The model is expected to minimize the quality give away in Propylene product.

AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS:

Many awards came to Kochi Refinery in 2022-23. The top ones being : *The Refinery Performance Improvement Award* for 2019-20 by Centre for High Technology, MoPNG; *'Best Productivity Performance' Award* in Industry Category -1 (Turnover above 600 Crores) of the KSPC-FACT MKK Nayar Memorial Productivity Award; *Best Energy Efficient Project* for IREP under PAT Scheme (2016-2019) by CHT; *'FICCI Chemicals & Petrochemicals Award'* for promoting "Make in India" by introducing Propylene Derivatives for the first time in India; *Product of the Year Award* at the Economic Times Energy World Annual Gas Conclave 2022 for exclusively manufacturing niche Petrochemicals; *IMC Ramakrishna Bajaj National Quality Award Trophy - 2021* in the Manufacturing Category or excellence in Quality Management in the manufacturing industry; *TERI 'Water Sustainability Award'* under the category of Wastewater treatment & Safe reuse; for "Facilitating the collection, treatment and reuse of wastewater towards the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal on Clean Water & Sanitation."; *KMA Excellence Award* for "Innovative HR Initiatives in Manufacturing Sector" and Second runner up for the in-house Magazine, JwalaDhwani; *Best Overall Refinery Award* (among BPCL Group of Refineries); Second runner up award in the *Ramakrishna Bajaj MQH Best Practices Competition; Excellence in Accounting and Compliance* across various Finance Functions in BPCL. and the Gold Medal in the *National Awards for Manufacturing Competitiveness (NAMC 2022)*.

We have carved our own benchmarks in each and every area of refining processes and technology. The days ahead call for complete focus on safety without any complacency, whatso-ever. At the Safety week observance I had taken the opportunity to welcome our business partners to the continuous commitment of safe working. We have to help and support them achieve higher safety benchmarks in order to ensure that our Refinery is the safest place to work. Let us use PSM and Digital more professionally for achieving these goals of safe and reliable operations.

We are expanding prospects through Petchem and smarter Refinery operations. From our combined experience, we know that while planning for energy efficiency, it has to be to the smallest step to reach our target value. The environment is the most sensitive asset for all, as clearly explained in *Mission LiFE*. Let us therefore give a deeper thought to the environment, with more focus on boundary and effluent management while we plan each activity in each project, new or ongoing. As refiners, our Reliability is in assuring plant availability and 100% efficiency. Together let our hearts beat constantly for all round efficiency, environment positivity and safety first.

Mr.Mathew P Thomas, General Manager(Power & Utilities, Mr. Joseph Rajan, Chief Manager (Oil Movement & Stock) and Mr.Anand Gopinath, Senior Manager (Environment) were also present from Kochi Refinery. The Director was given a warm welcome to the Refinery by Mr. Chacko M Jose, Executive Director (Operations). The Director was given a brief presentation and a tour of the Plant. Ms. Mamta had discussions with the members of the Refinery Council and was particularly keen on understanding the various ongoing and upcoming projects of BPCL at Kochi Refinery. Two technical officers from the E&S Dept were also part of the study visit.





DIRECTOR REFINERIES INAUGURATES REVAMPED DHDT CHARGE HEATER

Kochi Refinery has completed yet another Energy Efficiency Improvement measure with the revamp of the Charge Heater of the DHDT plant.

This was originally designed as a forced draft heater with one set of LP steam superheater coils and two HC coils as the heat recovery option. After a comprehensive study, two more rows of convection coils were added and it was converted to a balanced draft heater by the introduction of induced draft fan, plate type heat exchanger and other associated equipment.

All the modifications in existing heater was done during the recent IREP Turnaround in Sep 2022. Consequently, the stack temperature came down from 350 deg C to 160 deg C. The Test run of the revamped heater demonstrated an efficiency of 91.3%, an improvement by more than 9%, which is equivalent to a fuel saving of 230 kg/hr. More importantly, this revamp has helped to run the DHDT unit consistently at a charge of 600TPH against the design charge of 537.5 TPH, enhancing the diesel production capacity of the refinery. The project was completed at cost of Rs.18.5 crores and gives a return of Rs. 6.2crores/Annum on account of fuel saving alone.

Mr.. Sanjay Khanna, Director (Refineries) inaugurated the revamped heater in the presence of Mr.. Ajith Kumar, ED(I/c)-KR, Mr.. Chacko Jose, ED(Ops)-KR, Mr.. S Sriram, CGM(E&AS), Mr.. Senthil Kumar, CGM(Tech), Mr.. M Sankar, CGM(Mfg), Mr.. K Rajasekhar, CGM(AS) and other GMs, senior officers & team members on 7 March 2023. The project was conceived by the KR Energy Team and executed well before schedule by the E&C Team, supported by the Inspection and Maintenance Team.





KSPPL COMPLETES LAST STRETCH OF THE PIPELINE FROM KOCHI TO SALEM

The Kochi Refinery to Palakkad section of the Kochi Salem Pipeline Private Limited (KSPPL-JV of BPCL & IOCL) spanning 155 km, has been completed. The last segment was completed with the lowering of the final 700 m section near Kochi Refinery across FACT land, from the Refinery area to the proposed Polyols area.

This section of the pipeline is unique with the enormous challenges in terms of executional difficulties owing to the dense habitation, huge resistance from landowners, tough terrain, unfavourable weather conditions and the typical socio-economic conditions prevailing in the state of Kerala. The terrain warranted 103 nos. of Horizontal Directional Drilling (HDD) crossings. The exceptional feat was accomplished under the exemplary leadership of Mr. B V S Prasad, CEO- KSPPL (IOCL), Ms. Ramya R, CFO-KSPPL (BPCL), Mr. Krishnadas V, Project Manager- KSPPL (BPCL), Mr. Lineesh CF, SM (BPCL), Mr. Ajith Kumar (IOCL) and Ms. Anjana Menon (IOCL) along with untiring efforts from the whole KSPPL team.

Leading from the front for the entire process was Mr. Chacko M Jose, Executive Director (Operations), KR and Director (KSPPL), who facilitated necessary permissions from BPCL KR & FACT. The project was monitored meticulously by Director Mr. Biju Gopinath, Head-New Businesses, whose regular reviews with the PMC - EIL & Contractor KPTL gave impetus to project execution.
